


Congratulations also to Anna and Josh (Cronin) who have announced they are having baby No 2, a brother or sister for Amelia.




What's happening in the classroom



In Art we did activities relating to the book 'Room on a Broom' by Julia Donaldson.




In Maths we looked at Groups of and we learnt how to write Haiku poems.






We had fun chasing massive hail stones!!!! In Library we made the "Jack's House".

HOLIDAY FUN

BIRD SEED ORNAMENT

You will need

- 2 cups of native bird seed mix
- 4 tablespoons of flour
- 8 tablespoons of water
- 3 teaspoons of golden syrup
- Drinking straw
- Kitchen twine or string for hanging
- Mixing bowl and spoon
- Tray with parchment paper

Activity

- Mix it all together and then press out on a piece of baking paper about 2 cm thick. Using a cookie cutter cut the birdseed layer and remove the excess from the cutter.
- Now, using a drinking straw cut out a hole at the top then gently remove the cutter. Leave to dry overnight on the baking paper.
- The next day gently flip it over and let the other side dry. When dry use a length of string and feed through the hole at the top.
- Hang where birds can perch to feed.



MELTED PLASTIC STRAW JEWELLERY CRAFT

You will need

- brightly coloured drinking straws
- an iron
- baking paper
- a hole punch
- ribbon or string
- scissors

Method #1: Rainbow method

- Put a sheet of baking paper onto the ironing board and get Mum to heat the iron.
- Choose four or five coloured straws and arrange them together, side by side.
- Place the straws, in their colour sequence, onto the middle of the baking paper. Fold the paper over the top of the straws. The baking paper should be underneath and on top of the straws so that they don't melt onto your ironing board.
- Iron over the folded baking paper until the straws melt together.
- Wait for the melted straws to cool and then peel them off the baking paper.
- Trim the straws to fit snugly around your wrist.
- Punch two holes in each end and thread string through the holes to get your bracelet on and off your wrist.

Method #2: Snipped ends method

- Choose a selection of coloured straws. Snip 5mm pieces of the straws into a bowl until you have about a quarter of a cup.
- Pour the snipped ends onto the baking paper and fold the baking paper over the top.
- Iron the baking paper until the straw ends are melted together.
- Wait for the straws to cool, then peel the mottled melted shape off the baking paper.
- Cut it into a shape - e.g. heart, circle or diamond.
- Punch a hole in the centre of your amulet and thread string through to hang it around your neck.

Hints and tips:

You can make an amulet using the rainbow method, just melt a thicker band of straws together and cut the shape out of the melted rainbow. You can also make a bracelet using the 'snipped ends method.' Tip the ends onto the baking paper and arrange into a strip, melt with the iron and trim it into a bracelet.
