2023 Parent Opinion Survey - Each year, the school conducts an opinion survey amongst the school community. Results will be used to inform and direct our future school planning and improvement. You should have received an e-mail with details of how to access this survey. I ask you to please take the time to complete the survey as your opinions are important to us and will contribute to the future management and organisation of our school. The survey is conducted online by ORIMA Research and should take around 15 minutes to complete. The survey is open until **Friday 8 September.** The survey can be completed using any device connected to the internet (even a mobile phone). Should you require access to a device to complete the survey, please let the school office know. Please be assured that your responses are completely confidential. The survey is conducted anonymously and it is important to us that you complete the survey as honestly as possible. Your comments in the final open-ended question will be provided back to the school.

Transition dates for 2024 foundation students – Our transition program for 2024 foundation students will commence on Tuesday 29th August – 2.30pm-3.15pm and then continue the following Tuesday – September 5th, 12th and 19th. In Term 4 sessions will be at the same time on October 10th, 17th, 24th and 31st. Sessions on the 14th and 21st November will be half day sessions and then the 28th November and 5th December will be full day sessions leading up to the State Wide transition day on Tuesday 12th December.

Book Fair – We will be holding our Book Fair from 28th August – 1st September. The fair will be open from 8.30-9.00am and 3.30-4.00pm daily. We are seeking parents to volunteer some time to assist when the fair is open. If you can help, please let Erin know the date(s) and time(s).

School Student Broadband Initiative — (An announcement on behalf of Federal Member for Nicholls, Mr Sam Birrell MP). Access to a fast home broadband connection is important to support education and build digital skills in a world that is more reliant on digital technology. Families across Nicholls may be eligible to access free broadband internet services over the **nbn**® network through the Australian Government's School Student Broadband Initiative.

The School Student Broadband Initiative is providing up to 30,000 unconnected Australian families with school aged children (K-12) with free broadband services for one year. The Initiative will provide the opportunity for eligible school students to benefit from fast internet at home to support their education.

Children who can access online learning as part of their education are more likely to be engaged in classroom activities as well as helping to build digital skills in a world that is more reliant on digital technology. I know that connecting the internet at home to support learning and homework is difficult for some families, this initiative will relieve some of the barriers.

I am inviting families from across Nicholls to contact my office directly if they think they could benefit from this Initiative. To be eligible for School Student Broadband Initiative, families must:

- Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school in 2023.
- Have no current broadband internet connection over the nbn network at their home. This does not include having mobile internet such as via a smart phone.
- Live in a premises where they can access the nbn network.
- Be referred by an official nominating organisation.

Our office can refer families for this program. Families that are interested and think they may be eligible can contact sam.birrell.mp@aph.gov.au or morgan.dyer@aph.gov.au. Once a family is found eligible for the Initiative, they will be issued with a unique voucher, which they can redeem with one of the participating internet providers. The one-year of free service begins from the day the service is activated.




In the Gr 4-6 room....
