Parent Payment – Thank you to those who have paid their Parent contribution for this year. We appreciate your prompt attention to this as it greatly helps our finances at the beginning of the year when we have made big outlay for our back-to-school supplies. Breakfast Club – Breakfast Club has commenced on Wednesdays. This is a great opportunity for our students to come together before school to share breakfast in a fun, relaxed atmosphere. Students can partake in cereals, fruit, toast, eggs, spaghetti/baked beans, just to name a few of the dishes on offer. Any offers of assistance to help with cooking and washing up afterwards would be appreciated.

Camps, Excursions & Sports funding for 2024 – New families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply for CES funding. \$150 per year is paid for eligible primary school students. Payments are made directly to the school and are tied to the student. This money is used specifically to cover expenditure on camps, excursions and sporting activities throughout the year. Application forms are available from the school office. Please return these applications asap to ensure you receive your entitlement. Please also provide a copy of your concession card. If you received CSEF funding last year your application is automatically rolled over for this year.

Conveyance Allowance - Students may be eligible for a conveyance allowance when they:

• reside 4.8km or more from their <u>nearest</u> school/campus attended and there is no school bus service provided. If you think, you may qualify for this travel allowance please call into the office on a Monday to pick up an application form.

National Young Leaders Day – Our Gr 6 leaders attended the NYLD in Melbourne on Friday. This is a wonderful opportunity for students to hear from some outstanding individuals and learn how they have become who they are today. This year's speakers included -

Anastasia Woolmer who truly believes that the mind can be trained to perform remarkable feats without any exceptional abilities. She now trains athletes, performers, and others in memory techniques.

Bryson Klein is a multiple Australian ninja warrior grand finalist and has competed on the show since season 2

Jane Bunn is a highly accomplished meteorologist with over eighteen years' experience forecasting the weather in Australia and the US.

Melissa Barbieri is one of Australia's most well-known female footballers, making 86 appearances over 13 years for the Matildas. Melissa represented Australia in an incredible four World Cups, one of only two Australian women to do so. She represented Australia in the Olympic Games in 2004 and had the great honour of captaining the Matildas when they won the 2010 AFC Women's Asian Cup. Considered a goal keeping legend, she is a Football Victoria Hall of Fame member and in the 2023-24 A-League Women's season has been with Melbourne City as a playing assistant coach. This is a record breaking 26th season as a professional footballer.

School Council Elections – Nominations are currently open for 7 vacancies on School Council. Nominations close on 26th February @ 4.00pm. If nominations exceed vacancies council elections will take place closing on 12th March @ 4.00pm. If you are interested in standing for School Council please obtain a self-nomination form from the office.

To be a part of the council you don't need any particular qualifications or experience – schools look for enthusiastic parents who want to help improve the learning outcomes for all students. Effective councils have a broad range of experience, skills and expertise. Face-to-face and online training is also available to help councillors develop the skills and knowledge for the job. Parents find their involvement satisfying and may find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging, so please consider putting your hand up to fill one of these vacancies.

Personal property/goods at own risk - Personal property or goods brought to school are at the owners own risk. The Department of Education does not have an insurance policy covering these items and does not accept responsibility for anything that may happen to them. My advice is not to bring or allow anything of personal value to come to school.

Student accident insurance arrangements -The Department does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents and guardians are generally responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs involved. Student accident insurance policies are available from the private insurance market. These cover a range of medical expenses not covered by Medicare. They can be obtained by parents for individual students.

General Reminder - Food allergies are becoming increasingly common among children. We wish to advise we currently have student/s in your child's classroom who have severe allergy to nuts and/or other allergens - any exposure to these items, even a tiny amount, could be potentially very serious and life threatening for these children.

We ask our students and families to help make the school environment safer for all students, by following these simple suggestions:

- Please, where possible, try and avoid sending any foods that contain nuts, such as peanut butter or nutella sandwiches, muesli or health bars with nuts, to school with your child.
- Please always contact the Classroom Teacher *before* sending any food for sharing with the class for special celebrations like birthdays, Easter or Christmas.
- Please remind your child never to share his/her food and drinks with other students.
- Please wash your child's face and hands thoroughly before they leave home, especially if your child has eaten nuts/allergens prior to coming to school.
- Please remind your child often to wash their hands before and after eating.

We greatly appreciate your support for children with food allergies. Together we can make a difference.
