Parent Payment – School Council has set the voluntary parent payment at \$250.00 per student for 2024. This payment covers the cost of all materials and books that students use at school. Breakfast Club – Breakfast Club will commence on Wednesday 14th February at 8.30am, and will held each Wednesday of the term. This is a great opportunity for our students to come together before school to share breakfast in a fun, relaxed atmosphere. Students can partake in cereals, fruit, toast, eggs, spaghetti/baked beans, just to name a few of the dishes on offer. Any offers of assistance to help with cooking and washing up afterwards would be appreciated.

Camps, Excursions & Sports funding for 2024 – New families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply for CES funding. \$150 per year is paid for eligible primary school students. Payments are made directly to the school and are tied to the student. This money is used specifically to cover expenditure on camps, excursions and sporting activities throughout the year. Application forms are available from the school office. Please return these applications asap to ensure you receive your entitlement. Please also provide a copy of your concession card. If you received CSEF funding last year your application is automatically rolled over for this year.

Conveyance Allowance - Students may be eligible for a conveyance allowance when they:

• reside 4.8km or more from their nearest school/campus attended and there is no school bus service provided

If you think, you may qualify for this travel allowance please call into the office on a Monday to pick up an application form.

School Council Elections – Nominations for 2024 School council elections will be called for in the next few weeks. To be a part of the council you don't need any particular qualifications or experience – schools look for enthusiastic parents who want to help improve the learning outcomes for all students. Effective councils have a broad range of experience, skills and expertise. Face-to-face and online training is also available to help councillors develop the skills and knowledge for the job. Parents find their involvement satisfying and may find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging, so please consider putting your hand up to fill one of these vacancies.

Book club - The latest Book Club forms, with an order coupon on the back page, have been sent home today. Simply select any books you would like and return the order and money by the closing date or place your order online. The current issue is due back at school on Monday 26th February. There are often great buys to be found and of course, books are ideal presents for those special occasions.

Personal property/goods at own risk - Personal property or goods brought to school are at the owners own risk. The Department of Education does not have an insurance policy covering these items and does not accept responsibility for anything that may happen to them. My advice is not to bring or allow anything of personal value to come to school.

Student accident insurance arrangements -The Department does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents and guardians are generally responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs involved. Student accident insurance policies are available from the private insurance market. These cover a range of medical expenses not covered by Medicare. They can be obtained by parents for individual students.

Bushfire At Risk School - Reminder – Because we are **BARR** (a school listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register) school we remind parents of what will happen if a bushfire did occur in our area

School procedures for the bushfire season

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.

Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed when a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district. **Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.**

Where possible, we will provide parents with up to four days notice of a potential Code Red day closure by letter and SMS message. A Code Red day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Code Red day we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day.
- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days
- School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.
- Depending on which Bureau of Meteorology district is impacted bus route cancellations may affect our school.

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the CFA advise that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day.

As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan.

General Reminder - Food allergies are becoming increasingly common among children. We wish to advise we currently have student/s in your child's classroom who have severe allergy to nuts and/or other allergens - any exposure to these items, even a tiny amount, could be potentially very serious and life threatening for these children.

We ask our students and families to help make the school environment safer for all students, by following these simple suggestions:

- Please, where possible, try and avoid sending any foods that contain nuts, such as peanut butter or nutella sandwiches, muesli or health bars with nuts, to school with your child.
- Please always contact the Classroom Teacher *before* sending any food for sharing with the class for special celebrations like birthdays, Easter or Christmas.
- Please remind your child never to share his/her food and drinks with other students.
- Please wash your child's face and hands thoroughly before they leave home, especially if your child has eaten nuts/allergens prior to coming to school.
- Please remind your child often to wash their hands before and after eating.

We greatly appreciate your support for children with food allergies. Together we can make a difference.
