Any parents wishing to take children home after the event can do so after letting their teacher know. In the meantime, have students come to school with suitable footwear for their daily practice runs! See you there.

## Enrolling your child in Foundation (prep) 2025 (Please pass this information on to anyone you know who may be looking to enrol a Foundation student in 2025).

- Apply now to enrol your child in Foundation (Prep) for 2025.

If you have a child starting primary school in 2025, it's time to enrol. Make sure to submit your enrolment application by Friday 26 July 2024. If you are enrolling the sibling of a student at our school for Foundation in 2025, and both children will be attending our school at the same time, your child is prioritised for a place at our school as per the department's Placement Policy.

It is important to follow the statewide timeline to enrol your child in Foundation. Enrolling your child in line with the timelines allows us to plan our classrooms, staffing and transition activities and ensures your child has the best start to school.

# Steps to enrol your child in Foundation (Prep) for the 2025 school year

• To start primary school in 2025, your child will need to turn 5 years old by 30 April 2025. Schooling is compulsory for children who have turned 6 years old.

# **Starting primary school?**

Starting school is an exciting time for children, parents and carers. The first year of primary school is called Foundation or Prep. Below are some simple steps you should follow to enrol your child in a Victorian government primary school.



 If your child is starting Foundation (Prep) in 2025, you will be able to apply to enrol your child in a Victorian government primary school from the start of Term 2, 2024 (Monday 15 April 2024).

## What you need to do:

- Use <u>Find my School</u> to locate your designated neighbourhood school (referred to as your local school) and other nearby government schools.
- Contact a government primary school to book a school tour or to learn more about the school and the enrolment application process.
- Obtain a copy of the Foundation (Prep) Enrolment Information Pack for Parents and Carers from the office or our website.
- Submit an enrolment application for Foundation (Prep) by Friday 26 July 2024.
- You will be notified of the outcome of your application between Monday 29 July and Friday 9 August 2024. If you receive an enrolment offer, you should accept the offer by Friday 23 August 2024.
- Take part in information and transition sessions during Term 4, 2024.
- Your child will start Foundation (Prep) from Wednesday 29 January 2025.
- Enrolment applications submitted after 26 July 2024 will be processed by the school as they are received, in accordance with the Department of Education's Placement Policy.
- Your child has a right to enrol at their local school. Your child's local school is determined on the basis of their permanent residential address. Visit <u>Find my School</u> to locate your child's local school.

EVENT PROCEDURES 1.

- Participants will play on a short course with holes set up no longer than: 1.1 Par 3s - 150 meters Par 4s - 340 meters

  - Par 5s 430 meters Shorter tees will be setup for non handicap players by age group
- (primary & secondary) Maximum strokes per hole players without a handicap Once a player has ten strokes on any hole, the ball must be lifted with 10 placed against 1.2
- the relevant hole on the scorecard. Any deliberate attempt to hit the ball must be considered a stroke. No further strokes are permitted on a hole. 1.3 Bunkers
- After two shots in a bunker the player may pick up their ball and play it from the side of the bunker no closer to the hole. Should a player play directly from one bunker into another bunker then their next shot shall be deemed their second bunker shot. No extra penalty shot for placing the ball outside the bunker.
- Lost Ball 1.4
- If a ball is lost during play, a player must drop another ball at the point of entry to where the ball was lost under penalty of one shot. 1.5
- Each group must be accompanied by an adult whose responsibilities include safety, etiquette and scoring when necessary
- ELIGIBILITY 2
- Participants must be 17 years or under at the time of the event. 2.1

#### 3. ENTRIES

- The entry fee is \$30 A BBQ lunch is included and \$10 of the entry fee per player is paid to 3.1 the club to provide same
- All entries must be received by the due date via the 3.2

In accordance with Rule of Golf 4.3a(1), a player may obtain distance and direction information by use of a distance-measuring device. The provisions of Rule 4.3 apply in relation to Use of Equipment.

#### 10.

SUSPENSION OF PLAY The following signals will be used to suspend and resume play.

- Immediate stop for imminent danger one prolonged note of a siren
  Stop for a non-dangerous situation three consecutive notes of a siren.
- Resumption of play two consecutive notes of a siren
  Note: When play is stopped for imminent danger, all practice areas will be immediately close

#### RETURNING OF SCORE CARD 11.

A player's scorecard is officially returned to the Committee when the player has left the recordin office/area with both feet



Competition is to begin on Monday, the 29<sup>th</sup> of April and games will commence each Monday at 7pm.


As usual, there'll be incentives for early payment
